FIRST OPENED:

1959

ORIGINAL DESCRIPTION:

The Fine Arts Building housed the Art, Music and Speech Departments. The Speech Department facilities consisted of the University Theatre, which had a capacity for 472 persons and contained areas for workshops, paint shops, dressing room, costume shop, stage, a high grid plus amplifier and dimmer system. The second floor featured five classrooms, a seminar room, listening and reception rooms and two areas for offices. The first floor Music Department featured four classrooms, instrument room, broadcasting and recording booths, library, 14 private teaching studios, 24 practice cubicles, a work room for instrument repairs and offices.

DESCRIPTION:

The Stevens Building houses the School of Theatre Arts-which presents more than 70 performances per year and houses the O'Connell Theatre in addition to a smaller, flexible "black box" space-and the Anthropology Department.

RENOVATION DESCRIPTION:

The project includes demolition of the building's north wing of 27,200 square feet and an interior renovation of 21,000 square feet. The demolition area will be replaced with an addition which will include classrooms, laboratories, and offices for the Department of Anthropology. The addition will also include a new Black Box Theater with supporting scene shop space and a new 330 seat lecture hall. The remaining existing building space will be a complete interior and exterior rehab. The new building with addition will be approximately 109,000 total square feet.
