We are writing to let you know that if a state budget is not approved in the very near future, public higher education in Illinois will be damaged beyond repair and the consequences for the state will be severe.

In the next few months, a number of public universities and community colleges across the state will no longer be financially viable. Funds that have allowed them to remain afloat through this the seventh month of FY2016 will soon be completely exhausted. When colleges and universities reach this point of no return - when bills cannot be paid and payroll cannot be met - they will close. The results will be catastrophic for the economy of the State of Illinois and it will shatter the dreams and lives of hundreds of thousands of Illinois students and families.

As the public higher education leaders of the state we are bound by our duty to let you know how urgent this situation is and how close we are to not being able to continue operations. We strongly reiterate the commitment we made last spring to accept our responsible share of providing solutions to Illinois' fiscal problems.

Public higher education transforms people's lives and our society; it provides businesses and industry with the human capital needed to survive and thrive; and, it is one of the most critical economic engines in the state. When colleges and universities close, regional economies will be permanently damaged and the state will face an unprecedented crisis.

It is imperative that funding for public higher education be provided so that we can avoid these dire consequences and salvage the future of the state.
